Dear friends:

Christmas in the year of pandemic is a difficult time for everyone. Whether we were directly affected by Covid-related deaths or illnesses, we all were affected not only by the lockdowns and the physical limitations, but even more so by the emotional, psychological and spiritual sense of loss, contingency and sadness that has accompanied them. Living in the USA particularly we are accustomed to the comfort and security of feeling relatively insulated from the afflictions that beset so much of humanity. This year has to some extent reminded everyone in the world, us included, that human life is precarious and uncertain, capable of being upended by an invisible, microscopic pathogen that most of us had never heard of before this year. Add to that the social tensions in our society, and it seems as though the entire world has lost its balance, and perhaps in some ways its mind as well.

Although it may seem counter-intuitive, we can see in the Christmas season not only the consolation we need, but actually see the hope for a brighter and better future. For one of the clearest messages of the Advent and Christmas seasons is that no earthly power can fix this world which is inherently broken by the effects of original sin. The chief message of the prophets of the Old Testament was precisely that God's Chosen People had to look beyond their earthly sufferings and live with faith in the final, ultimate, even eschatological victory of God. That victory is what the Christ-Child initiated in Bethlehem. What was true in 587 BC for the desolated Hebrews in Babylonian exile is equally true for us today. We who put our hopes in the things of this world, will inevitably be disappointed. No matter their power or fame, princes, politicians, professors and celebrities are ultimately subject to the same blindness that afflicts all the children of Adam. As says Psalm 20, verses 7-8: *Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God. They collapse and fall, but we rise and stand upright....* Only Jesus offers us the fullness of vision that enables us to live happier lives on earth and eternal beatitude in the life to come. Only Jesus reigns, only God triumphs, and only the Kingdom of God can satisfy. So let us enjoy the comforts of our Christmas and New Year's celebrations, always remembering that the Good Lord has delights far more satisfying if we but learn to love them.

DE LA OFICINA DEL PASTOR

Queridos Amigos:

La Navidad en el año de la pandemia es un momento difícil para todos. Ya sea que nos viéramos afectados directamente por muertes o enfermedades relacionadas con Covid, todos nos vimos afectados no solo por los encierros y las limitaciones físicas, sino aún más por la sensación emocional, psicológica y espiritual de pérdida, contingencia y tristeza que los ha acompañado. Al vivir en los Estados Unidos, en particular, estamos acostumbrados a la comodidad y la seguridad de sentirnos relativamente aislados de las aflicciones que acosan a gran parte de la humanidad. Este año ha recordado hasta cierto punto a todos en el mundo, incluidos nosotros, que la vida humana es precaria e incierta, capaz de ser alterada por un patógeno microscópico invisible del que la mayoría de nosotros nunca había oído hablar antes de este año. Agregue a eso las tensiones sociales en nuestra sociedad, y parece que el mundo entero ha perdido su equilibrio, y tal vez de alguna manera también su mente.

Aunque pueda parecer contrario a la intuición, podemos ver en la temporada navideña no solo el consuelo que necesitamos, sino también la esperanza de un futuro mejor y más brillante. Porque uno de los mensajes más claros de las temporadas de Adviento y Navidad es que ningún poder terrenal puede arreglar este mundo que está inherentemente roto por los efectos del pecado original. El mensaje principal de los profetas del Antiguo Testamento fue precisamente que el Pueblo Elegido de Dios tenía que mirar más allá de sus sufrimientos terrenales y vivir con fe en la victoria final, última e incluso escatológica de Dios. Esa victoria es la que inició el Niño Jesús en Belén. Lo que era cierto en 587 a. C. para los desolados hebreos en el exilio babilónico es igualmente cierto para nosotros hoy. Nosotros, que ponemos nuestras esperanzas en las cosas de este mundo, inevitablemente estaremos decepcionados. Sin importar su poder o fama, los príncipes, políticos, profesores y celebridades están sujetos en última instancia a la misma ceguera que aflige a todos los hijos de Adán. Como dice el Salmo 20, versículos 7--8: *Algunos confían en carros y otros en caballos, pero nosotros confiamos en el nombre del SEÑOR nuestro Dios. Se derrumban y caen, pero nos levantamos y nos ponemos de pie....* Solo Jesús nos ofrece la plenitud de la visión que nos permite vivir vidas más felices en la tierra y la bienaventuranza eterna en la vida venidera. Solo Jesús reina, solo Dios triunfa, y solo el Reino de Dios puede satisfacer. Así que disfrutemos de las comodidades de nuestras celebraciones de Navidad y año nuevo, recordando siempre que el Buen Dios tiene delicias mucho más satisfactorias si aprendemos a amarlas.
