## THERE IS MUCH TO BE DONE

Growing up Catholic means I must have heard a million times the passage in Matthew's Gospel about how doing things for the "least of these" means you have done them for Jesus. Okay, that is an exaggeration to make a point. But it has been a slogan for so many social justice activities, from clothing and canned food drives, to letter writing campaigns and peaceful protests.

Growing up I only knew how to help the least of these through the school and church activities of the time. Today, YouTube and GodTube are filled with videos of creative ways people reach out to one another. Have you seen the one about the pizza party for the homeless? How about the fake lottery ticket or the house bought from online donations for a poor man? There are even videos of people paying for the

car behind them at the drive-through! The awesome thing about this is that it serves as a witness to others. It is not boasting but instead sharing the Good News. Giving and good stewardship can be contagious!

Our pastor has several times over the years handed out \$10 bills to confirmation candidates and asked them to "pay it forward." They can keep the money or use it to make a difference in someone else's life. One teen planted a garden for an elderly woman. One bought ingredients for brownies and sold them to give even more than \$10 to charity. The teens not only learned something about good stewardship in the process, but also served as great examples to the parish community.

As always, there is much to be done. The King is coming soon! Let's spread the news and some love at the same time!


## WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

The practice of Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In a particular way, Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass.

In a long-standing practice, a period of Eucharistic Adoration often ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faith with the Blessed Sacrament.

Several parishes throughout the United States have introduced the practice of perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, while other communities have the custom of shorter periods of Eucharistic Adoration. Care

should always be taken that these periods of adoration respect the instructions outlined in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, the liturgical book that gives the instructions for the proper celebration of Eucharistic Adoration.



Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist enshrined in the tabernacle or when it is exposed in the monstrance (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our eucharistic

devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion.

## FROM THE OGLE OFFICE

Dear friends:

We wish you and yours a **happy and blessed Thanksgiving**. Although holiday gatherings may be more limited than usual due to the pandemic, we can be grateful to God that we are surviving this terrible year with its various disasters. In the midst of the well-documented sorrow and losses, we can see certain good things that might not have otherwise come about. Some folks have been forced to focus on home matters such as long-needed repairs or long-delayed self-improvement projects. The introduction of virtual meetings has lessened commuting time for many. A *NY Times* article this week even mentioned that the pandemic has actually helped some adolescents grow closer to their parents and get more sleep, thus alleviating depression in many. But above all, we remember that God walks with us through every storm and can draw good from every evil if we have eyes to see. St Paul reminds us: *"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."* (Romans 8:28). Therefore we can also say with Paul as in 1 Thessalonians 5:18: *"In everything give thanks ..."* Does Paul say: *"In everything that is good give thanks ...?"* No; he says: *"In everything give thanks."* Both "bad" and good. Paul also writes: *"Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!"* Philippians 4:4. That's how thankful we'll be, if we believe in Romans 8:28. Let's make it a "Romans 8 Thanksgiving Day".

As mentioned in last week's letter, this is the time of the year when we normally have our **Scripture Sharing Groups** for the pre-Advent season. This season we will conduct the English-language program via Zoom (that is, via computer or phone) rather than in-person, and to have it during Advent itself rather than pre-Advent. Rather than numerous small groups, we will have a single group which I will lead in a Bible-study of the following Sunday's readings for the Sundays of Advent. We'll meet on Monday nights from 7:30 to 9:00 PM. The meeting dates are: Mondays: Nov. 23, Nov. 30, Dec. 7, Dec. 14, and Dec. 21.

In order to participate, you will need to **download the Zoom app** on your computer or smartphone. We have posted the access information (the same for all five meetings) at the church doors that you can copy. Or you may simply call the rectory office, providing your email address so we can send you the access information. We will also send the access information to those persons who were part of last year's groups for whom we have an email address. Each session will use a short video reflection which I will share with you on the screen, followed by some reflections and sharing. Those who do not have a computer or smartphone can simply phone into the meeting by telephone only, but will be unable to see the video portion of the meeting. You will, however, be able to hear and speak during the rest of the meeting. I do hope many of you can join us. (It is my hope that when we approach Lent, we will be able once again to meet in person, with all safety precautions taken, of course.) Here is the invitation itself:

Queridos amigos,

Les deseamos a usted y a los suyos un feliz y bendecido **Día de Acción de Gracias**. Aunque las reuniones festivas pueden ser más limitadas de lo habitual debido a la pandemia, podemos estar agradecidos con Dios por sobrevivir a este año terrible con sus diversos desastres. En medio de la tristeza y las pérdidas que experimentábamos, podemos ver ciertas cosas buenas que de otra manera no se habrían producido. Algunas personas se han visto obligadas a concentrarse en asuntos del hogar, como reparaciones necesarias desde hace mucho tiempo o proyectos de superación personal que se han retrasado mucho. La introducción de reuniones virtuales ha reducido el tiempo de desplazamiento para muchos. Un artículo del *NY Times* de esta semana incluso mencionó que la pandemia ha ayudado a algunos adolescentes a acercarse más a sus padres y a dormir más, aliviando así la depresión en muchos. Pero sobre todo, recordamos que Dios camina con nosotros en cada tormenta y puede sacar el bien de todo mal si tenemos ojos para ver. San Pablo nos recuerda: *"Y sabemos que a los que aman a Dios, todas las cosas les ayudan a bien, es decir, a los que conforme a su propósito son llamados"*. (Romanos 8:28). Por lo tanto, también podemos decir con Pablo como en 1 Tesalonicenses 5:18: *"Dad gracias en todo..."* ¿Dice Pablo: *"Dad gracias en todo lo bueno..."?* No; él dice: *"En todo da gracias"*. *Ambos "malos" y buenos*. Pablo también escribe: *"Gozaos siempre en el Señor. De nuevo diré, ¡regocíjate!"* Filipenses 4: 4. Así de agradecidos estaremos si creemos en Romanos 8:28. 


### WASH YOUR HANDS
